Surviving are Kenneth and Patricia Scott, Watertown, who took care of Mrs. Klock for many years, and several great-nephews, great-nieces and cousins.

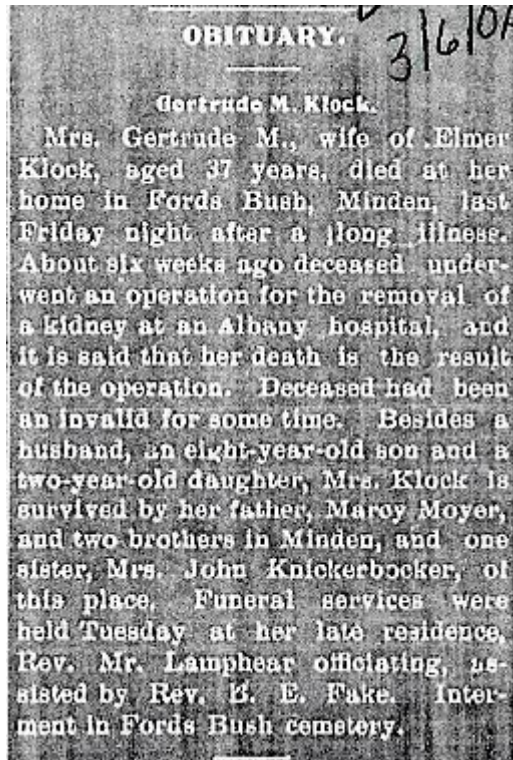

**Dr. Guy A. Klock, 77, Dies; Founder First Hospital Here**

Dr. Guy Klock, longtime resident and civic leader, who founded Daytona Beach's first hospital, dies at 8:25 last night at his home. Death came just two months after the prominent physician had retired after 47 years of practice and 10 days after his 77th. birthday. He lived at 210 South St. Dr. Klock was one of the oldest, practicing physicians in the City.

He moved here in 1906 after his graduation from the University of Michigan Medical School and founded Daytona Beach Sanitarium. He kept the Sanitarium open until 1944 when his only son, Floyd, an Air Force flight surgeon, died in a glider crash in England.

Dr. Klock and his son had planned to operate the place together after the war's end.

Dr. Klock was born in Edwardsville, New York and attended the State Normal School. He started his career as a country school teacher. He served in World War I as an Army Captain. He served as a member of old Daytona's Council and after consolidation as City Commissioner for two terms. As City Commissioner he fought and helped abolish a practice of spending all the budget money before the end of the year and then borrowing money on time warrants.

He was a member of the Elks, Moose and the Assn. of Military Surgeons.

He is survived by his wife, Willie of Daytona Beach; two daughters, Mrs. Robert Bozeman Ormond Beach and Mrs. W.J. Rose, Holy Hill; 11 grandchildren and five great grandchildren.



Some Reminiscences of the Family of Which He Was a Member

St. Johnsville: April 23—Irving Klock, whose tragic death occurred at Little Falls Wednesday, was well known here. He was a great grandson of George Klock, the well known revolutionary patriot of that name. Colonel George Klock resided between West St Johnsville and East Creek, the house and part of the farm being in the possession of Ray Hilderbrand, whose wife is the granddaughter of George Timmerman, the former proprietor, and one of the most prominent of St. Johnsville's farmers in his day. Considerable of the farm however belongs to Silbert Klock, son of the late Hiram Klock, who was the son of John B. Klock, son of Colonel George Klock. Other children of John B. Klock; Reuben, father of the deceased; David, who resided in Danube; Mrs. Henry P. Bellinger of St. Johnsville; Mrs. Henry D. Elwood of Florida, Montgomery county; Mrs. Charles Walrath of Oneida, and Elizabeth, who lived single. Reuben resided in the eastern part of Danube and was one of the substantial men of that town. He died about 1897. His wife, who survived him a few years, was Barbara A., daughter of Phillip C. Bellinger of Danube. Christian, Phillip's father, came from what is now the town of Root, the Bellingers having been among the earliest settlers in the valley. Christian came during the latter years of the 18<sup>th</sup> century. Although quite young at the time he had a record as a soldier of the Revolution. His wife was Barbara Devendorf, a lady belonging to a numerous connection among the Palatine settlers. Phillip (died February, 1872), was at one time the largest property holder in Danube. His wife, a lady of the Zimmerman family died a few years before himself. Phillip C. Bellinger is still remembered by those who had dealings with him as a man of

unimpeachable integrity, whose word was as good as his bond. Mr. and Mrs. Bellinger were the parents of 10 children, all of whom survived them. A few years ago one of the ten, Gertude, wife of J.M. Bellinger of Currytown, died. Other children of Christian and Barbara Bellinger were: Jacob Bellinger and Mrs. Peter Sharp of the town of Little Falls. Mrs. Conrad Mowers of Stark, Mrs. Conrad Snell of Danube and Mrs. Abraham Snell of Minden. Phillip C. Bellinger and his son-in-law, Reuben Klock, had many points in common, both were hard working, thrifty farmers, who achieved financial success in their calling, both were unswerving Democrats, without taste for political manipulation or greed for official distinction, and both held to the tents of the Universalist school in theology. Reuben Klock settled in the eastern part of Danube, not far from the Minden postoffice, and resided until his decease. Mrs. Klock also remaining there until she passed on a few years later. On the decease of his parents, Irving Klock came into possession of the home farm. A few years later, an invalid sister, the only unmarried one of the family, passed away, leaving him quite alone. Being alone in the world, he married Mrs. Peeler, widow of John Peeler (died 1896) of East Creek. Having no children to assist him, he decided to retire from active labor and leasing the farm removed to Little Falls. HE is survived by three brothers, Byron of Falls Hill, Danube, Elmer who resides in Danube, near Minden and Walter, who is an invalid and three sisters, Iantha, widow of Charles M. Zoller of Minden, Mary G., wife of George W. Spoor of Newville and Alice, wife of Fraser Showerman of Minden. Another brother, Emmett, who resided in Minden, opposite St. Johnsville, died there (where his family still resides), a few years ago. Another child died in infancy. Like his father, deceased was a Democrat politically, and a Universalist theologically. Other relatives are Frank P. Klock, of the First National Bank of St. Johnsville; Walter Elwood, who had a position in the educational work in the Philippines; Emery Bellinger of Sylvan Beach; Otto Bellinger of Los Angeles, Cal.; George P. Bellinger, ex-supervisor of Danube, and Earl J. Bellinger of Sherman, Chautauqua county, New York.

# Hunters Find Man's Body In Ditch Near West Monroe

## Investigator Rules Death Accidental

CENTRAL SQUARE — The body of a 53-year-old West Monroe man was discovered about a half mile east of West Monroe shortly after 8:30 a.m. Sunday by two Syracuse hunters, who notified state police at Pulaski.

Investigator Frank Diehl and Troopers J. F. Mazing and Walter McDonnell investigated and found the body of James C. Klock, 53, of Depot Drive West Monroe lying in a ditch near the road.

He was pronounced dead at the scene by Dr. William Burrell of Central Square.

Assistant Dist. Atty. Thomas McCarthy of Constantia was at the scene and ordered an autopsy to determine the cause of death. The body was taken to the Oswego County Laboratory at the Oswego Hospital.

State police learned that a car driven by Ben F. Brooks, 46, of Simons Drive Constantia, had struck an object around 9 p.m. Saturday night while Brooks was driving his daughters west on Route 49 near West Monroe.

#### Believed Hit Deer

Brooks stated that he hit an object which he believed was a deer and that he stopped his car and looked for the object but could not find anything. According to state police, Brooks then took his daughters to the dance and notified Deputy Sheriff Arthur Revoir that he believed he had struck a deer.

Brooks then went with his wife and Deputy Revoir to where he believed he had struck the object but they could find nothing. According to the state police report the accident was some distance from where the search was made the second time and it was believed that a deer had been hit and had made its way into the fields.

Investigator Feigl said that Brooks stated Sunday that when he went back to the scene with Deputy Revoir he became confused as to the exact spot the accident occurred and this second search was made several hundred yards east of the actual scene of the accident.

#### Autopsy Performed

According to Investigator Feigl an autopsy was performed at the laboratory Sunday and showed that Klock died instantly of a skull fracture and multiple internal injuries. A verdict of accidental death was issued by Assistant Dist. Atty. McCarthy according to Investigator Feigl.

Surviving Mr. Klock are his mother Mrs. Vera Klock of West Monroe, two aunts Mrs. Mabel Keller of Syracuse and Ms. Lella Cronk, and several cousins.
