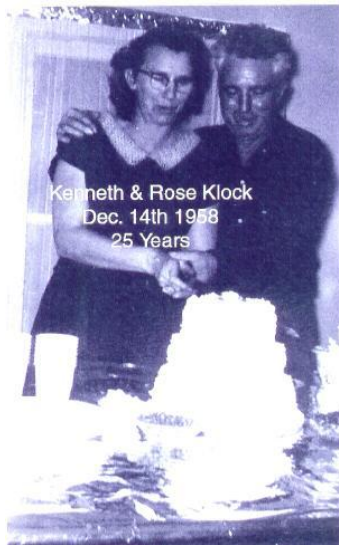

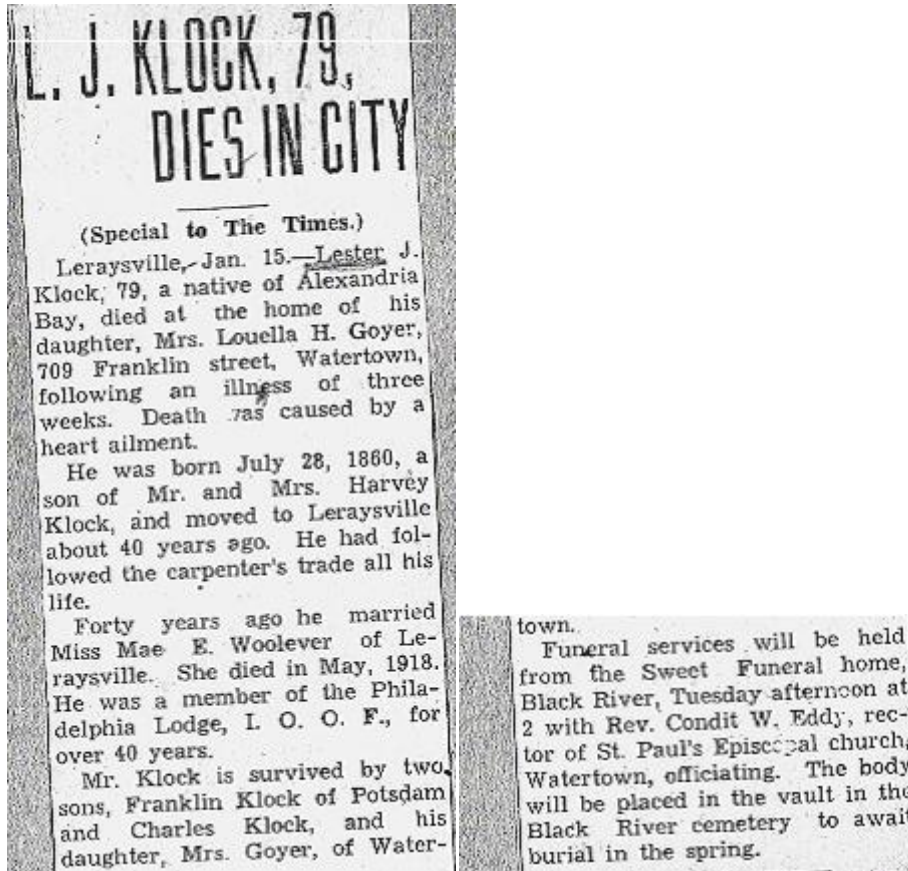

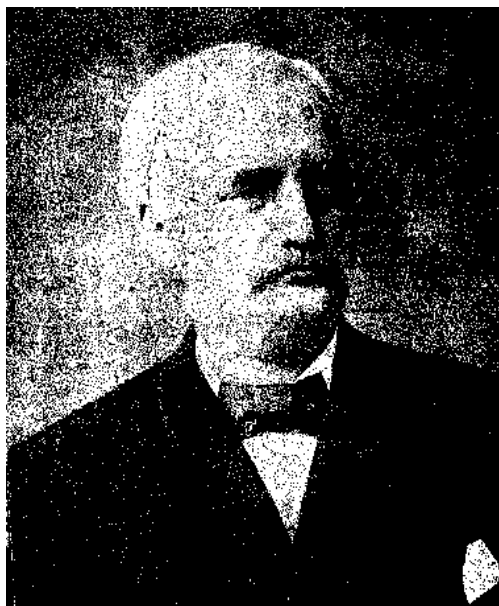

Old Little Falls Merchant Whose Active Career Has Closed.

Little Falls, Jan. 31.—Levi R. Klock, bearer of a name associated with the early history of the Mohawk valley and prominent in the annals of the revolution, has returned to his native earth. In his day a leading merchant and foremost citizen in the affairs of his home public, he departs with a career of active usefulness behind him, sincere respect attending his memory. Absolute probity was one of his chief characteristics. His nature was sympathetic and his impulses kindly. With him the cheerful word was ever foremost and the ready answer never lacking, for he possessed a pleasant humor that added life to any gathering in which he might be found. His death occurred at the home of his son, Irving L., in William street, Monday night and resulted from the effects of grip which his age poorly fitted him to resist.

Mr. Klock was born in the town of Little Falls June 24, 1832, and was a grandson of Capt. John Klock, one of our locally noted colonial patriots and an extensive landowner, his possessions once including an important section of this city. Our subject's mother was a descendant of the Herkimer and Rosecranz families. He was educated in the old Little Falls Academy, and since early boyhood, with the exception of a few years spent in Fort Plain, he had resided in this city. In 1858 he established the clothing business in the store now occupied by N. G. Lower, and for 35 years he was located in that one store, retiring in 1894. He was the first clothing dealer in this section to deal in ready-made clothing, the practice before he inaugurated the plan being to purchase the cloth and take it to a tailor to have made up. A man of excellent taste and thorough knowledge of his business, Mr. Klock built up a splendid trade, which he held by his square methods.

In politics Mr. Klock was a Democrat and in his early years was one of his party leaders. He served one term as village trustee, being in the board at the time George F. Crumby, then village president, died. Mr. Klock was selected by his fellow trustees to fill out Mr. Crumby's unexpired term. He was one of the charter members of the old Rescue Hook and Ladder Company and for many years was identified with the Fire Department. In 1853 Mr. Klock was united in marriage to Miss Lucretia Dillenbeck, who died in 1893. There survive three sons, Irving L., one of the city's police officers; Frank W., a former city clerk, and James R. Klock, and two grandchildren, Florence and Greta Klock. The funeral was held at 2:30 Thursday, Rev. Dr. Richardson, of the Presbyterian Church, which deceased attended, officiating. Interment was made in the Church Street Cemetery.
