David Bruce Klock, 47 of Great Mills, Md., died on Thursday, July 18, 2002 of heart failure at St. Mary's Hospital in Leonardtown, Maryland.

A graduate of Drexel University "79", and Pennsbury High School "73" David was a Systems Engineer at the Naval Air Warfare Center, Aircraft Division, Patuxent River, Md. Prior to moving to Maryland, he worked at the base in Warminster. Pa. until it closed.

Funeral services for David S. Klock, 63, assistant general manager of the Hunting Supply corporation, wholesale plumbing supply firm, who died suddenly at 12:45 Monday afternoon at his home, 267 Ward street, will be held Thursday morning at 11 at the S. J. Payne & Son funeral home. Rev. Don R. Boyd, pastor of Asbury Methodist church, will officiate. Burial will be made in Brookside cemetery.

Mr. Klock died of a cerebral thrombosis while sitting in a chair, about 45 minutes after he had left his work for the day at the Hunting company office and returned home. Because of poor health, he had been in the habit of working only a few hours a day, returning

home at noon.

While he had been ill since July 17 when he suffered his first cerebral thrombosis. Mr. Klock felt as well as usual Monday. He was about his home during the noon hour. He had just left one room and walked to the living room, where he sat down in a chair and was fatally stricken. Mrs. Klock found him dead.

He was also a member of old Company C and the old 30th Separate company of the New York state national guard and had served as secretary-treasurer of an organization formed a few years ago by members of the early national guard units.

Surviving him, besides his wife, Mrs. Caroline M. Sweeney Klock, and son, John S. (Jack) Klock, 267 Ward street, are two sisters, Mrs. Clarence (Harriet) Thornhill, New Hartford, N. Y., and Mrs. Elton (Helen) Young, Dillsburg, Pa.

Mr. Klock had been an employe of the Hunting company more than 30 years, beginning his career there as a clerk in the shipping room and stock room. Later, he was assigned to the office, where he was a general office worker until he became assistant general manager more than ten years ago.

He was born on Point Peninsula June 16, 1889, a son of the late Jay C. and Julia Watkins Klock. He was educated in the district schools and spent his youth on a farm on Point Peninsula.

Moving to Watertown more than 40 years ago, he was employed for a short time by the firm of A. H. Herrick & Son, Inc., flour and feed millers, and later by the Wool Products company, manufacturers of blankets and other woolen products. Subsequently, he entered the employ of the Hunting corporation.

Mr. Klock married Miss Caroline M. Sweeney, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Sweeney

of this city, on Aug. 28, 1912 in the Church of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, Rev. Cornelius O'Mahoney performing the ceremony.

He was a member of the Watertown Lodge, No. 496, B. P. O. E., and Garland City Council, United Commercial Travelers.

An ardent fisherman and hunter, Mr. Klock formerly belonged to sportmen's organizations.

Wednesday morning at 4 o'clock on the eighty-ninth anniversary of his birth, he died at the home of his son, two miles west of Ephrath village. Twenty years ago Wednesday his wife suddenly died.

West Monroe Man Killed On Rt. 49

Body Rolled Into Ditch

CENTRAL SQUARE — Sheriff's deputies, hampered by a lack of clues, continued today to search for the driver of an auto that killed a 46-year-old West Monroe man and fled the scene after rolling the body into a ditch.

The pedestrian was struck by a hit-run driver as he walked along Route 49, three-fourths of a mile east of this village, early yesterday morning.

The victim was identified as Denzil Klock, who was pronounced dead at the scene shortly after 7 a.m. by Dr. Marvin Brown of Cleveland.

An autopsy was performed at the Oswego Hospital and revealed that death resulted from a skull fracture and internal injuries, that included a ruptured heart. Klock also had fractures of his left arm and leg.

Oswego County Deputy Sheriff Arthur Revoir said that the accident apparently had occurred about 1 a.m. as Nick Schrong, who resides nearby, said that his daughters were watching a TV show at 1 a.m. when they heard brakes squeal and awakened him.

Schrong said that he looked out but believed that it was only a motorist with a flat tire and went back to bed. He was backing his car from the driveway shortly before 7 a.m. when he noticed a shoe beside the road and upon a closer look saw a body lying in a ditch on the south side of the highway.

Hit-Run Search Is Fruitless

OSWEGO — A week-long search for a hit-run motorist has failed to result in the apprehending of the guilty party. It was revealed yesterday by the sheriff's department.

The lifeless body of Denzil Klock, 46, of West Monroe was found lying in a ditch in Route 49, three-fourths of a mile east of Central Square, at 7 a.m. on June 8.

Sheriff's deputies investigated and learned that a family nearby had heard the squeal of brakes and loud talk six hours before the discovery of the tragedy.

Indications were that Klock was walking east when struck by a westbound machine. The occupants of the car apparently halted to drag the body into the ditch.

A description of an automobile, believed to be the death car has been furnished the sheriff's department.

Revoir arrived within a few minutes to find the lifeless body of Klock in the ditch with a shoe of the victim on each side of the highway and his pocket comb lying in the middle of the road.

Deputy Revoir said that the skidmarks indicated that Klock was walking east on the south side of the highway when struck by a west bound car traveling toward the village.

It is believed that the motorist that struck the West Monroe man, haled his car and moved the body to the side of the highway before continuing toward Central Square.

Mr. Klock had resided in West Monroe for many years and attended the Methodist Church. He was employed by L. C. Smith and Corona Typewriters, Inc. in Syracuse.

Surviving are: his mother, Mrs. Vera Klock and a brother, James Klock, both of West Monroe.

Services will be Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the Traub Funeral Home in Central Square by the Rev. Kenneth McQuinn, pastor of West Monroe Methodist Church. Burial will be in Hastings Cemetery. Friends may call tomorrow from 2-4 and 7-9 p.m. at the funeral home.

Franklin Pierce Klock who died in Syracuse on May 7, 1942, age 85 years, 2 months and 4 days was a native of St. Johnsville and spent most of his life here. A few moments later, Christopher Flander, cranesman, noticed that this had not been done and that the boat which he had used in making the first trip to the shore was fastened to a coal scow near the dredge, and it was evident that he had not made the second trip. No one saw the young man again or witnessed the accident.

The captain, Jerry Bodena, became alarmed and instigated a search for him. Mr. Flander first discovered a Prince Albert tobacco can floating by the row boat. When he touched it, it sank in the water and later with a pike pole he fished a cap out of the water, which was Klock's.

The whistles blew and summoned men from all the other dredges in the vicinity to assist in the search. The body was recovered about one hour later. In the meantime Dr. J. C. Jackson of Fort Plain had been summoned. All efforts to resuscitate him were unsuccessful. Dr. W.N. Simons, coroner of St. Johnsville was notified and the body was taken to the undertaking rooms of D. C. Schiffer in this village and from there to his home. Fred was a young man generally liked among the community. He was formerly employed in the Don market and his cheerful disposition won the favor of their patronage. His strongest ambition was to enter the service of the U. S. Navy. Two years ago last February Mr. and Mrs. Klock lost an older son, his death being presumably as a result from an injury received while employed as an engineer.
