Fort Plain, June 16—"This is the last knife I am going to get for you," Irving Klock told his ten year old son Roger today as the boy left for school. Roger had lost other knives his father had given him.

It was the boy's last knife. While playing on the school ground he fell on the open blade. It pierced his heart. A few seconds later he was dead.

About ten minutes prior to the opening of school this morning the pupils of Sand Hill school on Dutch town road just outside of this village, noticed the huddled form of Roger Klock on the floor of a summer house used by children as a playhouse. Roger was born in the town of Minden, 10 years ago and attended the school at which his death occurred, since his 5th year. He was considered a bright pupil and was well liked by his playmates. Besides his parents on sister survives.

Funeral services for Texas Tech professor Sheldon Klock Jr., 62, will be at 2:30 p.m. today at St. Christopher's Episcopal Church. He will be buried at Resthaven Memorial Park.

Klock, who taught Portuguese and Spanish in the Classical and Modern Languages department, had been at Tech since 1963.

Klock died Monday at University Medical Center of heart failure. Peder Christiansen, chairman of the Department of Classical and Modern Languages and Literature, said they had known he was ill, but his death still came as a surprise. "We were concerned from some time," Christiansen said. "His death came so quickly that it was still unexpected."

During his tenure at Tech, Klock was a member of the South Central Modern Language Association, the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese and the Southwest Council of Latin American Studies. He was also a member of Alpha Chi and Sigma Delta Phi honor societies.

One of Klock's recent achievements came last year when his book about Brazilian novelist Aluisio Azevedo was published in Canada.

Klock was born July 4, 1938, in Evanston, Ill. He graduated as the valedictorian from Edinburg High School in 1956 and attended Pan American University in Edinburg. Klock also attended Tulane University in New Orleans where he received his master's and doctorate's degrees in romance language. During this time, he was named a Woodrow Wilson Fellow and received a National Defense Foreign Language Fellowship.

He is survived by his wife, Celea Reyes, daughter Lillian Greathouse, son Sheldon C. Klock III and a grandson.

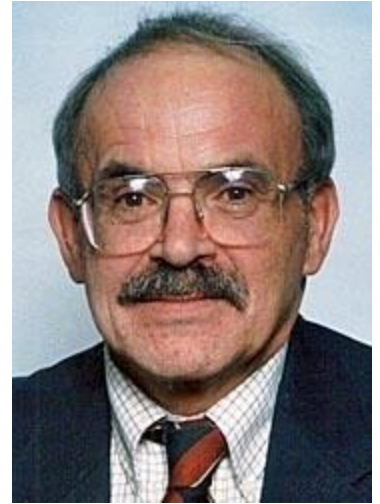
